When the doors to the Chumash Casino first opened in 1994, the line of eager guests wrapped around the building, indicating that the casino was going to be a successful venture for the Santa Ynez Band of Chumash Indians.

Guests were equally excited a decade later when the casino consolidation project was completed and the Chumash Casino Resort had a brand new gaming facility, several restaurants and an AAA Four Diamond-rated hotel.

In 2016, the Chumash Casino Resort entered a new era with the completion of the casino expansion project. An expanded gaming floor, a new hotel tower and more dining options provides guests with an exceptional entertainment experience.

Guests who visit the 24/7 Chumash Casino Resort can experience a dazzling array of 2,300 slot and video machines, more than 45 table games and a new Poker Room that features 12 tables. Bingo sessions are also available Sunday through Wednesday in the Samala Showroom with comfortable seating for up to 660 bingo players in a smoke-free setting.

A wide selection of dining options is available, including the Willows restaurant, The Buffet, the Chumash Café and a food court.

The addition of the new hotel tower adds 218 more rooms, bringing the total number of hotel rooms on property to 320. The rooms are beautifully decorated and feature Four Diamond amenities. Rooms with balconies on the top two floors provide spectacular views of the Santa Ynez Valley.

The impressive new Spa at the Chumash Casino Resort features nine luxurious treatment rooms, a spa-only retail space and its own dedicated pool deck that features a mineral pool, cold plunge and hot tub.

Not only does the Chumash Casino Resort serve as an outstanding entertainment destination, it also provides significant economic benefits to the community. The tribe employs 2,000 residents of Santa Barbara County and also makes a positive economic impact in other ways, such as purchasing goods and services from local vendors and donating to local non-profit organizations.
